The Alliance for Excellent Education (Alliance) organized an informational meeting on Wednesday, March 12, 2014 for organizations and parties representing various points of view concerning the E-rate program. The meeting was an opportunity to gain more information on what was requested by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) on March 6, 2014 in the request for focused comments on modernizing the E-rate program for schools and libraries (WC Docket No. 13-184) and on what Chairman Tom Wheeler called for in his recent public statements concerning the future of E-rate. Staff members from the FCC in attendance at the meeting included Patrick Halley, associate chief, Wireline Competition Bureau; Lisa Hone, deputy chief, telecommunications access policy divisions, Wireline Competition Bureau; and Michael Steffen, director of digital learning, Wireline Competition Bureau.

The meeting focused primarily on educating the attendees on the recent call for focused comments. FCC staff discussed what was contained in the call for focused comments and took questions on the publicly available information and what information was being sought by the Commission.
